

#### GOSPEL FOR PALM SUNDAY Mark 11:1-10

Blessings on him who comes in the name of the Lord.

When they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, and said to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat; untie it and bring it. If any one says to you, "Why are you doing this?" say, "The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately." And they went away, and found a colt tied at the door out in the open street; and they untied it. And those who stood there said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus, and threw their garments on it; and he sat upon it. And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is coming! Hosanna in the highest!'



## **HOLY WEEK 2021**

As we begin our celebration of Holy Week for a second year under Covid-19 restrictions, we look at what we can do. Of course, we can prayerfully follow the liturgies on-line, but we can also adapt rituals for use in the home. Some rituals are suggested in the pamphlet produced by the Diocesan Liturgy Committee, *Celebrating Holy Week at Home this Year*.

Unfortunately we cannot celebrate the Sacrament of Penance at this time. You are invited to join us for a Penitential Service on Wednesday at 7.30pm. This is not the sacrament but an opportunity for prayerful acknowledgment of God's mercy.

On **Holy Thursday** families in the Syro Malabar tradition have a family ritual of washing of the feet at home. Wouldn't that be a great acknowledgment of the central place the home as the Domestic Church? It may be accompanied by a prayerful reading of John's Gospel account of the washing of the feet.

On **Good Friday** there will be an opportunity for people to pray the Stations of the Cross outdoors around the grounds of the Cathedral. The outdoor stations are copies of the stations carved by Ken Thompson inside.

For many people the highlight of Easter in Longford is the Dawn Mass that is celebrated in the grounds of the Famine Graveyard in Saint Joseph's. On Easter Sunday morning this year **The Dawn Mass** will be celebrated in the Cathedral at 6am.
